

NEW OFFICES UNDER CONSTRUCTION AT SHREWSBURY BUSINESS PARK



Cooper Green Pooks, letting agents for Alaska Property Group, the principal developers of Shrewsbury Business Park report that three new office buildings are nearing completion and handover to their occupiers.

BOOST FOR SHREWSBURY TOWN CENTRE INVESTMENT



Shrewsbury Business Chamber works with Shropshire Council's Economic Development team, Shrewsbury Town Council, Shrewsbury & Atcham MP Daniel Kawczynski, and Shrewsbury BID to promote the town centre for its variety of shopping, leisure, social and business facilities.

Following the interesting discussion with Council Leader Lezley Picton in November, Shropshire Council recently outlined to the Business Chamber Executive the submissions to The Government for funding for various projects across the County.

We are pleased to report the announcement that about £18.7 million has been secured to contribute to the new development of offices, housing and leisure facilities on the former Riverside Shopping Centre and adjoining land . Whilst demolition was originally scheduled for May last year, hopefully this funding will now enable the scheme to proceed. Provisionally this includes a new 'Shirehall' with support offices , 250-300 homes, a transport hub , cinema, hotels and associated restaurants , etc and a 'quayside walk ' beside the River Severn. The funding is also allocated for improvements to Shrewsbury Railway Station.

Whilst some parties argue that "The Government took £10 from us in Local Authority cutbacks, and have only given us £2 back now ", and it was especially disappointing that that the project to try to restore bus services throughout the County was not supported, nevertheless Shrewsbury Business Chamber welcomes this announcement.

Charles Howell from the Business Chamber Executive said :

" This is a boost for the town centre to maintain

SHREWSBURY NORTH WEST RELIEF ROAD UPDATE

The planning application for the North West Relief Road is progressing, after a long delay as a result of technical discussions between Shropshire Council, The Environment Agency, Natural England and the Highways Agency.

The Council has now published a range of new documents on its Planning Application website which gives detailed information in response to the requests from Natural England and the Environment Agency. (Planning reference 21/00924/EIA).

The application details the proposed road which will link the A5 Telford -Weston Rhyn stretch (at its junction with the A458 Welshpool/Mid Wales road at Churncote), with the Battlefield Enterprise Park and A49 Whitchurch Road northwards at the Ellesmere Road junction. It will be about 4.3 miles long and will be a single carriageway road with crawler lane to part. It incorporates access points into the new housing and commercial areas at Oxon, thereby removing congestion from Welshpool


Road .lt is also designed to benefit Shrewsbury Town Centre by the provision of two flood storage areas and (with through traffic much reduced) allowing a much wider scope for the redevelopment of Smithfield Road/ Riverside.

Villages between the A5 and the Ellesmere Road , blighted by 'rat runs' over many years should also see reductions in through traffic .

The budget figure of &81 million, dating from 2019, is now cited as being insufficient. There is lobbying for an increase in the Government grant, but it is understood that decision will only be made if and when the planning consent for the scheme is secured.

With the latest technical submissions now made, the planning application has opened for further public consultation until Mid - March , prior to determination by Shropshire Council Planning Committee.

Shrewsbury Business Chamber has supported the application for a new road for many years, whilst being mindful of the changing trends of environmental concern. Individual members have objected or had reservations about specific details. As a continuing project we work with Shropshire Council, Shrewsbury & Atcham MP Daniel Kawczynski, Midlands Connect, Shrewsbury Town Council and others to try to improve the transport infrastructure which serves the town .

FIRMS IGNORE CUSTOMERS' GREEN CHOICES AT THEIR PERIL



Businesses which fail to understand their customers' views on the environment are putting their future at risk, according to a county carbon literacy expert.

A recent survey by leading polling firm, YouGov, showed that a massive 72 per cent of shoppers think seriously about sustainability when they make buying choices.

Sue Burnell, of Shropshire-based Business Net Zero, which helps small to medium firms get started on their carbon reduction journey, has warned that businesses who don't take this societal shift seriously will see a drop in revenue.

"Whether it's a product in their hands or the general ethos of a business in its approach to protecting the environment, customers are prioritising spending their money with organisations which demonstrably share their beliefs about green practises.

"I think this should be a huge wake-up call to companies in every sector that it's time to get on the carbon reduction journey as soon as possible if they haven't already."

Most large companies, especially blue chip and multinational organisations, are already heavily invested in understanding, mitigating and explaining their carbon footprints and are on a journey to net zero carbon, even if it might take them a long time to get there, Sue explained.

In many cases they are bound to do so by ever-tightening national regulations or pressures from others in their supply chains.

But she added: "It can feel like a really big deal for smaller businesses to begin the process of understanding

where they create emissions and other environmental impacts and often they just don't know where to start. "Small business owners have a million-and-one things to do every day, often just to keep the wheels turning, never mind to delve into an issue that doesn't feel like an immediate priority.

"But we're in a place as a society now where each lost day is taking them deeper into the risk that their customers, suppliers, regulators, even their staff, are going to be questioning what they are doing to protect the environment.

"What we hope to do is help micro, small and medium firms start learning straight away that there are things they can do immediately which produce results. "This means they start to make a positive impact which they can be proud to share with their customers and partners. Our aim is to give them a clear start on this journey, helping them understand what works and where to look for support and ongoing learning. That start makes this unavoidable process manageable, enjoyable and, ultimately, protective for their business and for the people on this planet!"


